Over **200,000** health workers immunize **230 million** children in Africa.

**2014**

Nigeria records its last polio case for the year on 24 July.

**2015**

The World Health Organization may remove Nigeria from its list of polio-endemic countries this year.

**2017**

Arrive at a certified polio-free Africa?

**NO STOPPING**  
Nigeria must go **2 more years** without a new polio case.
